Come join us for the Convention 2020 flag raising Monday April 27th at 11 a.m. at the downtown Civic Centre patio. Members may wish to buy lunch and/or shop in lovely downtown Chatham, prior to participating in the Resolutions Workshop, led by Colleen Perry, OPC President, at 2:30 p.m. at the John D. Bradley Chatham-Kent Convention Centre.

The opening mass will be celebrated Monday at 4:30 pm at Blessed Sacrament Church, 145 Victoria Ave, Chatham. <u>Please</u> <u>note there will be no mass shuttles/buses</u>. Members must arrange their own transportation to/from Monday's opening mass and Tuesday Bishop's mass/Wednesday's Closing mass, both held at St. Joseph's Church, 180 Wellington St. W., Chatham. Parking is plentiful; however, car pooling is suggested. A CK map is included in this registration package.
