Educate

As corresponding secretary you have the privilege of sending cards for various reasons. Receiving a card can be comforting, it can be uplifting and a joyous time. Think back to moments in your life where you received a card be that a birthday, get well, thinking of you or a sympathy card. A card makes a difference in the life of the one receiving it.

Engage

Remember why you are sending the card and to whom. It is important to be sensitive to the person you are sending it to.

Empower
