## **ENGAGE**

There is a new process for the presentation of resolutions. The "resolved clause" will be referred to as the resolution. The resolved clause should be worded positively, forcefully, with a degree of firmness and so it makes sense on its own. The clause should include the name of who is requesting the action, the title of the official or group to whom the resolution is directed, and the action requested. The "whereas clauses" will no longer be presented as part of the resolution. The material that was previously contained in the "whereas clauses" will now be part of the brief. At the resolutions dialogue, members receive the "resolved clauses" and briefs to focus on. Members then review the resolution, keeping in mind the following questions: 1) Is this an issue for the League? 2) Is this resolution timely/emergent?

### **EMPOWER**

Just a reminder that if you are writing a resolution, the title and short descriptive summary of your resolution is to be submitted to me by October 1<sup>st</sup> and the whole resolution, (resolved clauses, brief and research bibliography) is due by October 15<sup>th</sup>.
